

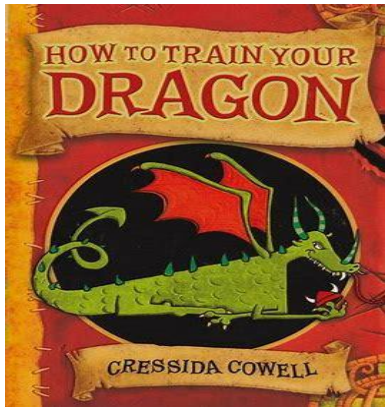

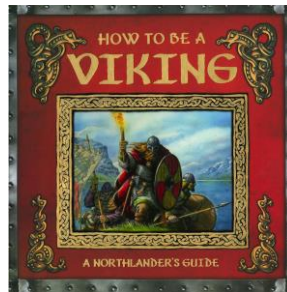

We're halfway through the year now. Lots more exciting learning to come!



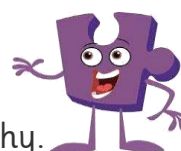
HOW TO TRAIN YOUR DRAGON

Encourage your child to read at home every day and make sure they bring their book and new reading diary to school every day too.

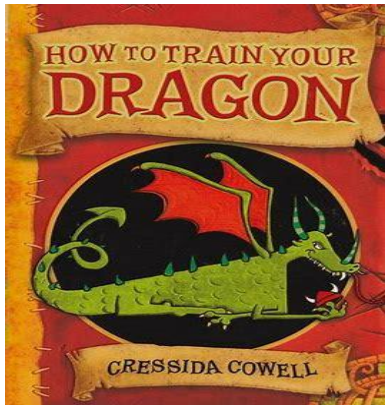




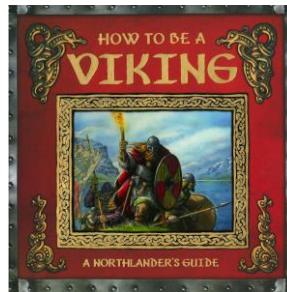

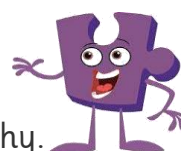
